Executive Summary

The escalating humanitarian crisis in Sudan, marked by mass displacement and severe infrastructure damage, demands urgent and multi-sectoral intervention. Over 150,000 people have been killed in conflict-affected areas, and millions have been displaced—both within Sudan and across borders. More than half of the population now urgently requires humanitarian assistance, including over 14 million children, with hundreds of thousands at risk of death due to hunger and lack of access to safe drinking water.

Droplets of Mercy has scaled its efforts to provide essential, life-saving aid across vulnerable regions. This report outlines our completed work in immediate food security, ongoing efforts through soup kitchens, and critical upcoming projects focused on long-term health, water, and emergency response—demonstrating our commitment to transforming every droplet of kindness into an ocean of hope for those most affected.

Sudan Crisis Context: The Urgent Need

The ongoing war in Sudan has led to one of the world's most severe humanitarian emergencies. Millions are internally displaced, food insecurity is catastrophic, and critical infrastructure, especially Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), as well as Health facilities, have been decimated.

To address this overwhelming crisis, Droplets of Mercy has been working to alleviate suffering by providing life-saving support through emergency food distributions, ongoing meal programs, and upcoming projects focused on clean water, healthcare access, and emergency relief.

Uganda hosts one of the largest refugee populations in the world, with nearly 2 million refugees and asylum seekers, including a rapidly growing number of Sudanese individuals who fled after the conflict intensified in April 2023. By mid-2025, more than 85,000 Sudanese refugees have been registered, with continued arrivals every week.

This influx is driven by ongoing conflict, economic collapse, and severe food insecurity in Sudan, leaving families heavily dependent on humanitarian assistance once they reach Uganda. However, critical funding gaps have forced drastic reductions in support, and the World Food Programme has cut refugee food rations by nearly 50%, leaving Sudanese refugees, many without access to income or alternative food sources, at heightened risk of hunger and malnutrition.

UPCOMING PROJECTS



Intervention Sectors

The ongoing conflict in Sudan has devastated communities, disrupting access to clean water, overwhelming healthcare systems, and worsening food insecurity, leaving families in urgent need of support. *In response, Droplets of Mercy is expanding its interventions across three critical areas.* The *Pediatric and Neonatal Care Recovery Project* is restoring essential medical services in children's hospitals, equipping pediatric and neonatal units with the supplies and infrastructure needed to treat vulnerable children in war-affected regions.

The *Emergency Aid Project in Tawila* is providing hot meals and temporary clinic shelters for families displaced by conflict, ensuring immediate nutrition and basic healthcare for those forced from their homes. Meanwhile, the *Water Wells Projects in Al-Hariz and Al-Masoudiya villages* are creating reliable access to clean drinking water, reducing the risk of waterborne diseases and improving overall community health. *By addressing these urgent needs in health, food, and water, these initiatives aim to save lives, protect dignity, and strengthen resilience in Sudan's most vulnerable communities.*

Programmatic Engagement – Field Visits

Droplets of Mercy is planning a programmatic *field visit to Sudan involving a delegation of respected imams and community influencers.* The visit is designed to provide direct exposure to ongoing humanitarian projects, allowing participants to observe implementation processes and assess program impact at the community level.

The field visit will also serve to strengthen transparency and accountability by facilitating direct engagement between stakeholders, implementing teams, and beneficiary communities. Through firsthand observation and structured interactions, participating leaders will gain a deeper understanding of humanitarian needs and response efforts.

This engagement is expected to contribute to increased awareness, informed advocacy, and sustained support for humanitarian operations in Sudan.

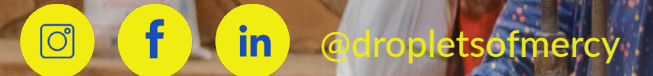
